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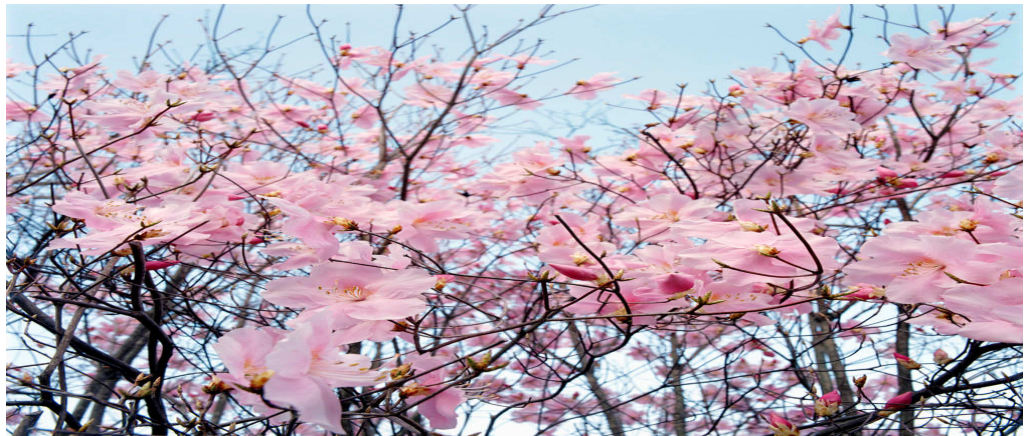

Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder

Post-traumatic Stress disorder (PTSD), once called shell shock or battle fatigue syndrome, is a serious condition that can develop after a person has experienced or witnessed a traumatic or terrifying event in which serious physical harm occurred or was threatened. PTSD is a lasting consequence of traumatic ordeals that cause intense fear, helplessness, or horror, such as a sexual or physical assault, the unexpected death of a loved one, an accident, war or natural disaster. Families of victims can also develop post-traumatic stress disorder, as can emergency personnel and rescue workers.

Most people who experience a traumatic event will have reactions that may include shock, anger, nervousness, fear, and even guilt. These reactions are common; and for most people, they go away over time. For a person with PTSD, however, these feelings continue and even increase, becoming so strong that they keep the person from living a normal life. People with PTSD have symptoms for longer than one month and cannot function as well as before the event occurred.

What are the symptoms of PTSD?

Symptoms of PTSD most often begin within three months of the event. In some cases, however, they do not begin until years later. The severity and duration of the illness vary. Some people recover within six months, while others suffer much longer.

Symptoms of PTSD often are grouped into three main categories, including:

Re-living: People with PTSD repeatedly re-live the ordeal through thoughts and memories of the trauma. These may include flashbacks, hallucinations and nightmares. They also may feel great distress when certain things remind them of the trauma, such as the anniversary date of the event.

Avoiding: The person may avoid people, places, thoughts, or situations that may remind him or her of the trauma. This can lead to feelings of detachment and isolation from family and friends, as well as a loss of interest in activities that the person once enjoyed.

Increased arousal: These include excessive emotions; problems relating to others, including feeling or showing affection; difficulty falling or staying asleep; irritability; outbursts of anger; difficulty concentrating; and being “Jumpy” or easily startled. The person may also suffer

Who gets PTSD?

Everyone reacts to traumatic events differently. Each person is unique in his or her ability to manage fear and stress, and to cope with the threat posed by a traumatic event or situation. For that reason, not everyone who experiences or witnesses a trauma will develop PTSD. Further, the type of help and support a person receives from friends, family members and professionals following the trauma may influence the development of PTSD or the severity of symptoms.

PTSD was first brought to the attention of the medical community by war veterans, hence the names shell shock and battle fatigue syndrome. However, PTSD can occur in anyone who has experienced a traumatic event. People who have been abused as children or who have been repeatedly exposed to life-threatening situations are a greater risk for developing PTSD. Victims of trauma related to physical and sexual assault face the greatest risk for PTSD.

How Common Is PTSD?

About 3.6% of adult Americans—about 5.2 million people suffer from PTSD during the course of a year, and an estimated 7.8 million Americans will experience PTSD at some point in their lives. PTSD can develop at any age, including childhood. Women are more likely to develop PTSD than are men. This may be due to the fact that women are more likely to be victims of domestic violence, abuse, and rape.

How IS PTSD Diagnosed?

If symptoms of PTSD are present, the doctor will begin an evaluation by performing a complete medical history and physical exam. Although there are no laboratory tests to specifically diagnose PTSD, the doctor may use various tests to rule out physical illness as the cause of the symptoms.

If no physical illness is found, you may be referred to a psychiatrist or psychologist, mental health professionals who are specially trained to diagnose and treat mental illnesses. Psychiatrists and psychologists use specially designed interview and assessment tools to evaluate a person for an anxiety disorder. The doctor bases his or her diagnosis of PTSD on reported symptoms, including any problems functioning by the symptoms. The doctor then determines if the symptoms and degree of dysfunction indicate PTSD. PTSD is diagnosed if the

And stoop and build 'em up with worn-out tools:

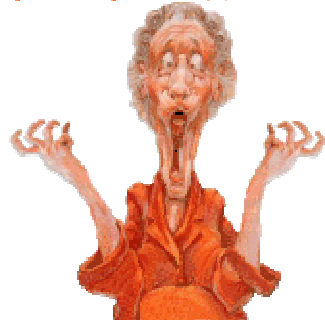
If you can make one heap of all your winnings

ONE, TWO, THREE STRIKES, I'M OUT

Strike One. In 1994, the Baseball Players Union struck in mid-season and the rest of the season was cancelled. There was no World Series.

Strike Two. In 2004, the Hockey Union struck and wiped out the 2004-2005 season. There were no Stanley Cup playoffs.

Strike Three? NFL owners are preparing a lock-out and the NFL players are not even participating in labor negotiations.

Professional athletes tend to make the assumption that fans are impartial in judging the merits of demands made by players and owners. But fans want to see players in action in arenas and on the field. Fans will have limited sympathy for players who will not play. In no other labor vs. management dispute is there emotional involvement directly with tens of millions of people. Rooting for the home team can hardly be compared to rooting for the Teamsters or the UMWA.

After the 1994 World Series was wiped out, fan attendance for the next several years at major league baseball games was down dramatically. Not until the 1997 season did attendance rebound. This was due in large part to the record-breaking home run duel between Sammy Sosa and Mark McGuire. It is very ironic that this dramatic home run chase that enthralled fans was tainted by steroid use on the part of both sluggers. What would Roger Maris have said if he had still been living?

When players show contempt for fans by cancelling an entire post-season, is it any surprise that some fans are permanently alienated? Personally, I will never again pay my own money to see a professional baseball or hockey game.

Early Wynn was a Hall of Fame pitcher for the Indians and White Sox during the 1940's and 1950's. He was a very aggressive pitcher, known for throwing bean balls at hitters who were dug in at the plate. He would brush back any hitter who stood too close to the plate. A sportswriter once asked Wynn, "You're so mean that you would knock down your own grandmother, wouldn't you?" Wynn's reply was, "Only if she was crowding the plate."

Sal Maglie was a great pitcher for the New York Giants in the 1950's. He was known as The Barber. This was because he would throw at a batter's chin and give him a close shave. This is how I feel about professional sports teams: They continue

to throw at me and knock me down.

Hall of Fame manager Joe Torre was a great catcher in his playing years. He has commented on how much more fun his peers had playing baseball, even though they earned a small fraction of what current players make.

The Brooklyn Dodger players of the 1940's and 1950's were literally part of their community. Almost all lived locally, and would interact with fans when they met them on the street or in stores.

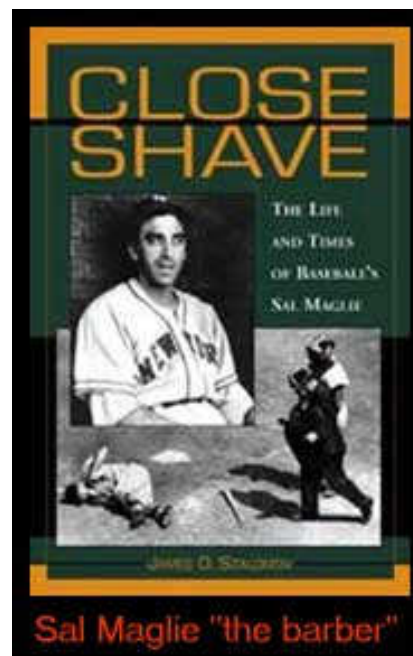
In contrast to the Steinbrenner era Yankees, the Yankees of the 1940's and 1950's were paid less than the average salary of major leaguers at that time. The New York general manager was a notorious skinflint. The Yankee players counted on being in the World Series year after year, because their World Series checks gave them additional income. Yankee players prided themselves on great fielding and avoiding mental mistakes. There was an intense desire to win, to continue the tradition of Yankee excellence and dominance. Yankee rookies were warned not to let the team down, to continually play smart baseball.

Sport fans were rewarded in past years by seeing players perform for other motives than mere financial rewards.

Rather than seeing games in present-day sports where strikes are always a threat, I

would greatly prefer to see games of the long-ago past. If only games such as these could have been recorded in their entirety ...

Blonde Brownies

- 2 cups flour
- 2 t Baking powder
- 1/2 cup butter or margarine
- 2 cups brown sugar
- 2 eggs
- 1 t vanilla
- 1 cup chopped walnuts

Grease a 13x9x2 inch baking pan. Combine flour, baking powder & 1/4 t salt. Melt butter & remove from heat. Stir in sugar. Add eggs & vanilla; — Stir till combined. Stir dry ingredients & walnuts into sugar mixture. Spread in pan. Bake in 350 degree oven 20-25 minutes. Cut into bars while warm. Makes 48 bars.



ONE , TWO , THREE STRIKES YOU'RE OUT contd.

In 1929, Ernie Nevers and the Chicago Cardinals beat Red Grange and the Chicago Bears 40-6. Nevers had six touchdowns and four extra points. Nevers' record of 40 points in an NFL game has never been equaled.

In game three of the 1927 World Series, Babe Ruth clouted three home runs and Lou Gehrig added another homer, as the Murderers Row Yankees beat the Cardinals.

In game four of the 1929 World Series, the Chicago Cubs were leading the Philadelphia Athletics 8-0. Philadelphia exploded for 10 runs in one inning, a feat never done before or since in the World Series.

In the fourth game of the 1947 World Series, Yankee pitcher Bill Bevens was one out from a no-hitter. Pinch-hitter Cookie Lavagetto hit a three run double, and the Brooklyn Dodgers managed to win a game in which they recorded only hit.

In the second game of the 1956 World Series, Yankee pitcher Don Larson was knocked out in the second inning. Larson came back in the fifth game to pitch a perfect game, the only one ever in the post-season.

In a 1948 NBA game, Joe Fulks, the inventor of the jump shot, scored an incredible 63 points in one game. This was done in an era of low-scoring games; it was more than 10 years before this record was broken.

In 1950, the Cleveland Browns came into the NFL, They had dominated the smaller league that they had been in, and which had folded. The Browns first game of the season was against the defending champion Philadelphia Eagles. Cleveland beat the Eagles badly, and went on to win the NFL championship.

In the seventh game of the 1962 World Series, Roger Maris saved the series for the Yankees with an incredible throw from right field to third base, keeping the base runner from scoring the potential tying run.

In December of 1962, the Dallas Texans defeated the Houston Oilers for the AFL championship. This becomes the longest football game ever played. The game is decided by a field goal in the 6th quarter of sudden-death overtime.

In the Spring of 1962, the Boston Celtics experienced amazing good fortune on the way to the NBA title.

In the seventh game of the Eastern Conference Finals with the score tied 107-107, and only five seconds left, the Philadelphia Warriors and Wilt Chamberlain are left shaking their heads. Boston's Sam Jones takes an off-balance jumper that barely catches the side of the rim, buckskins straight up, and falls through the hoop. Chamberlain suffered the first of his four seventh game defeats to the Celtics, by a grand total of only 9 points.

The Celtics go on to play the Los Angeles Lakers in the NBA finals. In the seventh game with the score tied and 2 seconds left, the Lakers' Frank Selvy missed a wide-open 12 foot jump shot. The game goes into overtime and Boston wins again.

The games that I have just detailed are only a small fraction of dramatic contests that have been played in the long-ago past, when sports were truly still a game. Big money had not yet corrupted professional sports, and the fans themselves were the big winners.

"What's this?" the umpire says. "Called strike three? Does that mean the NFL season has been cancelled, or was it just that big roundhouse curve that caught the corner of the plate while I stood there with the baseball bat on my shoulder? Either way, I'm out, and I'm going to sit down at the end of the bench."

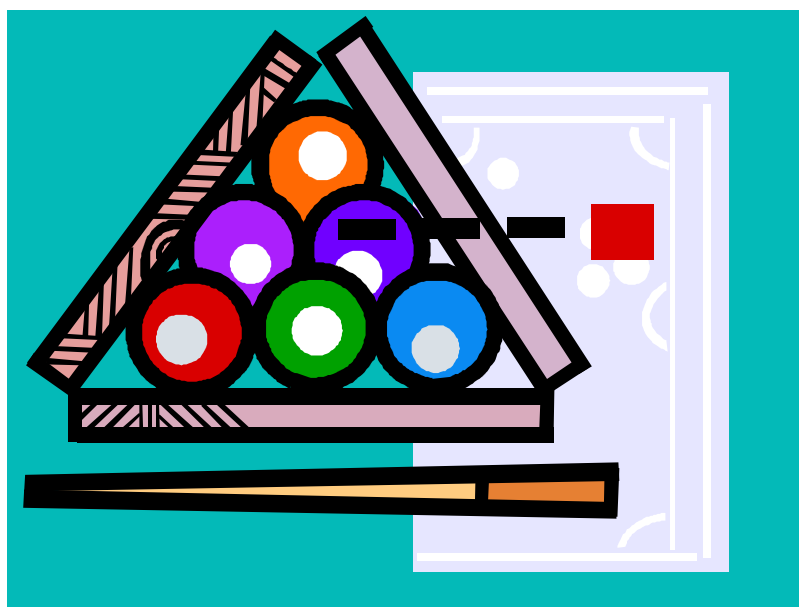

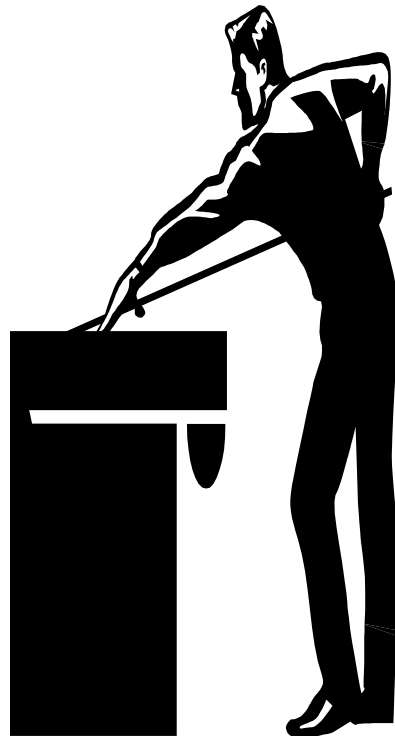

How Is PTSD Treated?

The goal of treatment is to reduce the emotional and physical symptoms associated with PTSD, to improve daily functioning and to help the person better cope with the event that triggered the disorder. Treatment for PTSD may involve psychotherapy (a type of counseling), medication, or both.

Medication

Doctors use antidepressant medications to treat PTSD and to control the feelings of anxiety, and its associated symptoms, including selective serotonin uptake inhibitors (SSRI's), such as Paxil, Celexa, Luvox, Prozac, and Zoloft, and Tricyclic antidepressants such as Elavil, and Doxepin. Tranquilizers such as Atavan and Klonopin; mood stabilizers such as Depakote, Lamictal; and neuroleptics such as Seroquel, and Abilify, are sometimes used.

Psychotherapy

Psychotherapy for PTSD involves helping the person learn skills to manage symptoms and develop ways of coping. Therapy also aims to teach the person and his/her family about the disorder, and help the person work through the fears associated with the traumatic event. A variety of psychotherapy approaches are used to treat people with PTSD, including :

Cognitive Behavior Therapy, which involves learning to recognize and change thought patterns that lead to troublesome emotions, feelings, and behavior.

Exposure Therapy, a type of cognitive behavior therapy that involves having the person relive the traumatic experience, or exposing the person to objects or situations that cause anxiety. This is done in a well-controlled and safe environment. Exposure therapy helps the person confront the fear and gradually become more comfortable with situations that are frightening and cause anxiety. This has been very successful at treating PTSD.

Psychodynamic Therapy focuses on helping a person examine personal values and the emotional conflicts caused by the traumatic event.

What is the outlook with people with PTSD?

Recovery from PTSD is a gradual and ongoing process. Symptoms of PTSD seldom disappear completely, but treatment can help sufferers cope more effectively. Treatment can lead to fewer and less intense symptoms as well as a greater ability to cope by managing feelings related to the trauma.

Research is going into factors that lead to PTSD and to finding new treatments.

Can PTSD be Prevented?

Some studies suggest that early intervention with people who have suffered a trauma, may reduce some of the symptoms of PTSD or prevent it all together.
